1. General information

Fraser and Neave, Limited (the "Company") is a limited liability company incorporated and domiciled in Singapore and is listed on the Singapore Exchange Securities Trading Limited ("SGX"). The registered office of the Company is located at 438 Alexandra Road, #20-00 Alexandra Point, Singapore 119958. The immediate holding company and ultimate holding company are InterBev Investment Limited and Charoen Num Sub 1 Co., Ltd respectively.

The condensed interim financial statements as at and for the six months and the year ended 30 September 2025 comprise the Company and its subsidiaries (together referred to as the "Group").

The principal activities of the Group are:

- (a) production and sale of beverages and dairy products; and
- (b) printing and publishing.

These activities are carried out through the Company's subsidiaries, joint ventures and associates. The Company provides management and administrative services to some subsidiaries.

2. Basis of preparation

The condensed interim financial statements for the six months and the year ended 30 September 2025 have been prepared in accordance with Singapore Financial Reporting Standards (International) ("SFRS(I)") 1-34 Interim Financial Reporting issued by the Accounting Standards Council Singapore. The condensed interim financial statements do not include all the information required for a complete set of financial statements. However, selected explanatory notes are included to explain events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the Group's financial position and performance of the Group since the audited financial statements for the year ended 30 September 2024.

The condensed interim financial statements are presented in Singapore Dollar and all values are rounded to the nearest thousand (\$'000) unless otherwise stated.

The Group and the Company have applied the same accounting policies and methods of computation in the preparation of the interim financial statements and are consistent with those used in the Group's financial statements for the year ended 30 September 2024 which were prepared in accordance with SFRS(I)s except for the adoption of various new and amended accounting standards which are effective from 1 October 2024. The adoption of these new and amended accounting standards did not have a material impact on the financial statements of the Group and the Company.

In addition, the Group has applied SFRS(I) 1-41 *Agriculture* for the first time upon commencement of a new dairy farm in Malaysia during the financial year.

SFRS(I) 1-41 Agriculture

(a) Dairy Herd and Crops

The Group's biological assets comprise dairy herd and crops. Biological assets are measured on initial recognition and at the end of the reporting date at their fair value less costs to sell. Changes in fair values are recognised in profit or loss in the period in which they arise.

Feed and other related costs are capitalised until such time as the heifers begin to produce milk, bulls and male calves are ready for sale or crops are ready for harvest.

(a) Agricultural produce

Agricultural produce, such as milk and harvested crops, is measured at fair value less costs to sell at the point of milking or harvest. Such measurement is considered the deemed cost for the purposes of applying SFRS(I) 1-2, *Inventories*.

Gain or loss on initial recognition of agricultural produce is recognised in profit or loss in the period in which they arise.

2. Basis of preparation (cont'd)

2.1 Use of estimates and judgments

In preparing the condensed interim financial statements, management has made judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expense. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The significant judgements made by management in applying the Group's accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty were the same as those that applied to the audited consolidated financial statements as at and for the year ended 30 September 2024.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimates are revised and in any future periods affected.

3. Seasonal operations

The Group's performance is normally not affected by seasonal or cyclical events on a year to year basis. However, on a half-yearly basis, the demand for certain products may be skewed towards major festivities, events and weather pattern.

2. Review of performance of the Group

Statement of profit or loss for the 12 months ended 30 September 2025

Revenue increased 7.4% to \$2,322.8 million, an increase of \$160.7 million from \$2,162.1 million last year. PBIT of \$308.1 million was an increase of 3.7% from \$297.0 million while attributable profit before fair value adjustment and exceptional items remained stable at \$150.4 million.

Beverages

Revenue from Beverages increased by \$103.8 million to \$772.1 million, 15.5% higher than last year mainly from Beer operations in Myanmar as the Group's *TAPPER* beer, launched in mid-2024, continues to gain traction and drive higher sales volume. Growth in Soft Drinks revenue was supported by higher water volumes and new product launches.

Underpinned by the increase in revenue, PBIT improved 5.8% to \$40.1 million. While Beer achieved stronger profitability on the back of higher sales and reduced operating expenses, Soft Drinks benefitted from favourable cost environment, operational efficiencies and positive forex translation.

Dairies

Dairies revenue increased by \$69.0 million, a 5.7% increase to \$1,276.4 million for the year mainly due to higher Dairies sales in Thailand and Malaysia which were lifted by strong export and domestic canned milk sales in key markets and positive forex translation. Commencement of commercial milking operations at F&N AgriValley alongside maiden contribution from the Malaysia School Milk Programme also supported the revenue increase.

Dairies PBIT grew 6.1% to \$262.1 million propelled by higher sales, favourable input costs environment, disciplined advertising and promotion spend and positive forex translation. The increase in PBIT was moderated by start-up expenses incurred for the dairy farm and the decline in share of results from the Group's associated company in Vietnam, Vietnam Dairy Products Joint Stock Company ("Vinamilk").

Printing and Publishing

Printing and Publishing ("P&P") revenue decreased 2.3% to \$196.6 million primarily due to the absence of one-off title sales and licensing contracts recorded by the publishing business last year. The decline was partly mitigated by increased production volumes achieved by the sustainable print packaging business, driven by global supply chain diversification and rising demand for eco-friendly paper packaging.

Losses increased from \$1.5 million to \$5.5 million attributed to lower contributions from Education and Print businesses which were impacted by absence of last year's one-off sales and unfavourable input costs environment.

Tax

The Group's effective tax rate ("ETR") of 20.6 % (FY 2024: 18.0 %) can be attributed to the decrease in non-taxable income following the expiry of a tax incentive in one of the subsidiaries in Thailand.

Statement of financial position as at 30 September 2025

The decrease in Reserves was due to currency translation loss of \$156.6 million mainly arising from the depreciation of the Vietnamese Dong against the Singapore Dollar on the Group's interest in Vinamilk and payment of dividends of \$80.1 million. This was partly offset by profits of \$141.3 million retained for the year.

Non-current assets increased by \$14.5 million from \$3,866.4 million to \$3,880.9 million as at 30 September 2025. The increase in property, plant and equipment was mainly due to capital expenditure incurred in relation to the integrated dairy farm in Malaysia and dairy plant in Cambodia offset by the decrease in investment in associates, due to the impact of unfavourable translation of the Group's interest in Vinamilk partly cushioned by the share of results of Vinamilk.

Current assets decreased by \$182.8 million or 13.7% from \$1,336.0 million to \$1,153.2 million. This was mainly due to the decrease in cash balances, as a result of capital expenditure incurred and repayment of borrowings, and decrease in other receivables due to subsequent receipt of dividend receivable outstanding as at 30 September 2024.

Liabilities decreased by \$108.1 million or 5.9% from \$1,821.7 million to \$1,713.6 million mainly due to repayment of bank borrowings.

Statement of cash flows for the 12 months ended 30 September 2025

The cash inflows and outflows are detailed in the Group Cash Flow Statement.

Net cash inflow due to operating activities for the year was \$231.2 million as compared to \$216.4 million mainly due to the increase in cash generated from operations partly offset by higher income tax payments.

Net cash outflow due to investing activities of \$191.1 million was higher as compared to \$20.0 million last year mainly due to increased capital expenditure incurred for the dairy farm in Malaysia and dairy plant in Cambodia, purchase of livestock for the dairy farm and decrease in dividend received from an associate due to timing of dividend declared.

Net cash outflow due to financing activities for the period was \$201.5 million as compared to \$119.1 million last year due to net repayment of borrowings during the year.

Statement of profit or loss for the 6 months ended 30 September 2025

Group revenue increased 1.8% to \$1,110.2 million as compared to the corresponding period last year mainly due to increased contribution from Dairies and Beverages as a result of successful promotional campaigns and new product launches.

Supported by the increase in revenue, PBIT increased 6.4% to \$143.0 million as compared to the corresponding period last year. This was mainly driven by increased profitability in Dairies as a result of higher sales, lower input costs and improved cost efficiencies.

As compared to the corresponding period last year, group attributable profit before fair value adjustment and exceptional items remained flat at \$66.3 million.

Amidst the on-going global trade and geopolitical tensions and financial markets volatility, the Group continued to build resilience across its business units. Driven by strong brand execution, innovation and cost discipline, our businesses have continued to perform well. These efforts, together with the benefit of favourable cost and currency environment helped the Group deliver growth in revenue and earnings despite regional operational challenges, broader economic headwinds and cautious consumer sentiment.

In Malaysia, during the year, the Group's integrated dairy farm continues to make strong progress and remains on track towards commercial scale-up. The farm welcomed its first commercial herd of 2,500 dairy cattle in April 2025 and herd expansion has since progressed well. It now houses over 6,500 cattle of which 2,500 dairy cattle have just arrived and are currently under quarantine. Pilot milking operations commenced in mid-2025 and the adjacent dairy manufacturing facility is on track to begin commercial production in Q1 2026, which will be marketed under the F&N *MAGNOLIA* brand. The project remains on track towards commercial scale-up, strengthening the Group's upstream integration and supporting F&N's commitment to sustainable business practices.

In Cambodia, the Group continues to strengthen its regional manufacturing capabilities with the development of a new dairy manufacturing facility. Construction of the plant is progressing as planned, with operations expected to commence early 2026.

In the P&P segment, the Group remains focused on driving operational improvements and repositioning the business for sustainable recovery. While the Group continues to accelerate the scaling up of Green Lab's operations to turnaround Print operations, we also strive to deepen Education's international reach and strengthen Book Distribution. These efforts, coupled with disciplined cost management and targeted investment in growth segments, are expected to build long-term resilience and sustainable success.

As the Group looks ahead, we will continue to strengthen our brands, leverage digital and sustainability initiatives and pursue opportunities that drives growth and create lasting value for our shareholders.
